### UNITED LABOR MOVEMENT DELIVERS VICTORY

More so than in any other election in recent memory, this year's race for the United State Senate pitted against each other two candidates that couldn't have been further apart on the issues. Labor's endorsed candidate, Senator Bob Menendez, has spent his entire career serving the working families that have elected him to represent them from the school board level all the way up to the House of Representatives. His opponent, however, has chosen a different path and has voted wrong on important working family issues such as the minimum wage and social security. There was never a doubt that he would be nothing more than another rubber stamp for the failed Administration of George Bush.

Knowing that Senator Menendez would maintain his incredible 100% voting record on our behalf, organized labor lauded Senator Menendez' appointment to the United States Senate earlier this year and quickly began supporting his efforts to win a full term in that body. He knew that the road to victory went right through the labor movement and charted a course for his campaign that took him to countless union halls, labor rallies and worksites across the state. The polls remained close and financial resources tight, making the role of organized labor all the more critical.

The efforts of a united labor movement on behalf of Senator Bob Menendez, our endorsed House candidates, and the 50 rank-and-file union members that sought public office were unprecedented. Together, we distributed more than 1.2 million worksite flyers, sent out nearly one million pieces of mail, made more than one million phone calls and knocked on more than 250,000 doors.
